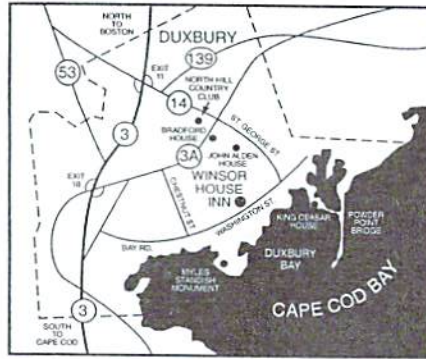

When making advance reservations at the Inn, please be reminded that just as we are making a commitment to the guest, the guest is also making a commitment to the Winsor House Inn. Therefore, in accordance with the Inn's reservation policy, all charges will be processed at the time the reservation is made. A deposit of 50% is required on all reservations of more than three nights. For reservations of three nights or less, a deposit of one night is requested. To ensure a refund of a reservation deposit, cancellations must be made more than 30 days prior to arrival (a \$25. cancellation fee will be deducted from the refund). If a reservation is cancelled within 31 days, payment in full will be charged to your credit card if we are unable to rebook the cancelled dates. Deposit and cancellation policies also apply to date changes and early departures. The individual making the reservation is responsible for all payments.

The Winsor House Inn is a small, privately owned Inn. We strive to maintain a sense of comfort and relaxation for our guests. Guest's rooms are double occupancy only and the maximum number of guests in our suites is four. Outside visitors are discouraged from entering any guest room without first checking with the Innkeeper. Smoking is not permitted in the town of Duxbury.



### Directions

**From the North and Logan International Airport:** When exiting the airport, follow the signs to Boston. Leaving the tunnel, follow the signs I-95 & Rt. 3 South. I-95 & Rt. 3 split approximately 15 miles south of Boston. Follow Rt. 3 South (toward Cape Cod) to Exit 11. At the end of the ramp, bear right onto Rt. 14 East. Continue through the traffic lights (intersection of Rt. 14 and Rt. 3A) until the street ends, in the middle of which will be a flagpole. Turn right onto Washington Street. The Winsor House is 3/4 of a mile on the right. You will have travelled about 4 miles from Rt. 3 to the Winsor House.

**From the South:** Rt. 3 North to Exit 10. Bear right on to Rt. 3A North. When you come to a blinking yellow light (1.4 miles), turn right on to Chestnut Street. At the end of Chestnut Street will be a flagpole, which serves as a rotary. As you go around the flagpole, turn onto Washington Street (the Exxon station will be on your left). The Winsor House is 1.1 miles on the left.

**From Providence and T. F. Green Airport:** When exiting the airport, follow the signs to I-95 North. Continue on I-95 North to I-95 East (toward Cape Cod). In Fall River, take Rt. 24 North to Rt. 44 East to Rt. 3 North. Follow the directions above, from the South.

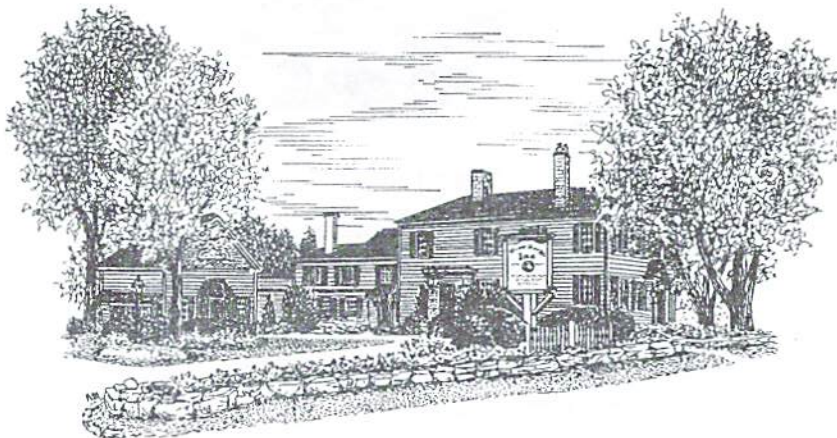
### The Inn

Originally a private residence, the Winsor House Inn was built in 1803 by Nathaniel Winsor - patriarch, merchant and sea captain - for his daughter, Nancy, and her husband John Howland. At that time, the town of Duxbury was in the midst of a prosperous era of shipbuilding and merchant sea trade. The Winsor clan was one of the more prominent families of the period.

Daniel Winsor, a long-time sea captain, was living in the house as late as 1860. Daniel's great grandson, George, left Duxbury in 1896 to sail for England with his wife, Harriet, and their infant son, Daniel. In 1915, young Daniel inherited the Duxbury estate. He was, by then, nineteen years of age and an officer with the British Naval Intelligence.

Daniel and his bride, Marie, returned to Duxbury in 1932 to establish an Inn at the family homestead. Because he loved English pubs, he recreated one in a wing he added to the original house. He then appointed himself bartender and the Winsor House Inn remained a popular and fashionable spot under the congenial eye of the Winsors until their retirement in 1962.

For fourteen years, the property passed among many owners until David and Patricia O'Connell purchased the Winsor House Inn in 1976. The O'Connells have lovingly restored the Winsor House Inn to its original warm atmosphere and are continuing a long tradition of gracious hospitality.
